FACT!

### Birds that live on the water are known as water birds or water fowl.

Look at the photographs. These birds can all be found here. They don't all look the same, but because they all live in or around water they have similarities including webbed feet and oily feathers. Why do you think webbed feet and oily feathers are so common amongst these birds?



Male and female Mallard ducks look very different. The males have green heads and yellow beaks, the females have brown feathers and orange beaks.

Which is harder to see on the lake? Why do you think the females have brown feathers?

Chalk Farm Lake is a popular fishing lake that is used by the Aldershot Garrison Angling Club and home to a variety of different species of fish including the common carp.

The common carp is one of the longest-living freshwater fish and can reach the age of 40. These fish are not a native species, they were probably brought by the Romans and kept for food by monks in the middle ages.
